This newsletter summarizes an IES practice guide titled "Organizing Instruction and Study to Improve Student Learning," which aims to supplement and inform teachers' instincts and experiences by identifying research-based instructional strategies that teachers of all content areas can use to improve student learning. The practice guide makes seven recommendations: (1) space learning over time; (2) interleave worked example solutions with problem-solving exercises; (3) combine graphics with verbal descriptions; (4) connect and integrate abstract and concrete representations of concepts; (5) use quizzing to promote learning; (6) help students allocate study time efficiently; and (7) ask deep explanatory questions. The strategies of encouraging students to become more metacognitive and asking deep-level questions go hand in hand. The ultimate goal is for students to learn to ask themselves and their

peers deep-level questions in order to assess and build their own deep understanding of mathematics.
